COMMANDERS NOTES:

The year is almost gone again! We are starting to look towards gearing up for the holiday season which is moving in on us rapidly. Let's see what's been happening.

We installed most of the new officers at the Sept. meeting but we have a couple to still do. The new alarm system is in. We've had a few problems with equipment breakdowns - luckily nothing we coudn't get fixed and be able to financially cover. The construction is moving along and looks close to being done. Bingo is still hanging on and we are currently working with a skeleton crew, which is awesome. Everone is working hard and getting the job done so we can get through this low time - great teamwork!

I came across some info I thought I'd pass along as it's a huge issue these days, and that is **Identity Theft.** Did you know you can get a free credit report from each of the three national credit agencies each year? You can call 1-877-322-8228, or write to the Annual Credit Report P.O. Box 105281 Atlanta GA. 30348-5281 or go to <u>www.annualcreditreport.com</u> to set up your free annual reports. Since you get one from each agency per year, the best thing is to set them up so you receive them at different intervals during the year. The three agencies are Equifax 1-800-525-6585, Experian 1-888-397-3742 and TransUnion 1-800-680-7289 - these are the numbers to contact if you suspect fraud.

How do you know if your information has been compromised? You should be checking over all bank statements, credit card statements and unusual mail to see if you have unknown bank withdrawals, credit charges or statements that you never signed up for. Sometimes we can flip right past things if we don't take the time to really look. Sometimes we look at who it's from and decide not to open it because we don't have an account with that company - take the time to check it out. Even if it isn't in your name it could be your social security number and address. Sometimes what is unusual is you won't see anything - your mail will just stop arriving. Diverting your mail to keep you from seeing the mounting bills is a tactic thiefs use. If you see anything unusual, you need to act immediately.



Close the account, file a police report, file with the Federal Trade Commission and dispute the charges by signing an affidavit with the company. Some of your consumer rights are "time sensitive" so act quickly. You can contact the credit companies to request a "Fraud Alert" be placed on your file.

Keeping your information private is harder and harder these days. Shred all thrash with your name, address, credit numbers, account numbers, anything you tpss away. Don't forget to be careful with social media. People give all kinds of personal info on Facebook and other sites. Your pets name, your bank name, your favorite color, activity, or pet names for loved ones, kids' names or even favorite places should never be used as passwords. If you use Wi-Fi your information can be picked out of the air so be careful what you say and where you are while using it.

There's another type of fraud that's gaining popularity -Medical ID Theft. Some people use it to receive medical treatment; others use it to bilk your insurance company. If you receive a statement for services, check it over and make sure it's treatment you received. Fraud not only increases the cost of insurance, it could be dangerous to have someone else's health information in your health record. When you have an appointment and the clerk goes over your information make sure it's all correct. If something doesn't match let them know immediately.

If you have the misfortune to receive a letter from the IRS saying your tax records do not match, you could be a victim of Tax Fraud. Someone is using your Social Security number to work under or receive benefits. You should contact the IRS immediately and they will connect you to an Identity Protection Specialist who will work with you to resolve the issue. You can get information on their website or contact 1-800-9084490.

Remember, just because you deleted everything off your old computer before you gave it away or recycled it, your information can still be recovered off of it. Only a Wipe Program will totally clean your information out.

Protect yourself, keep your information safe. If you find something questionable; question it! Don't forget to pass this information on to family and friends so we will all stay safe.

Some of you have changed your e-mail address without letting us know. This results in the non-delivery of the monthly newsletter. Last month we had six addresses returned. For every e-mail address we have, we save 31 cents on postage.

We now have a security system installed at the Post. There are two 360 degree cameras inside the building, and one outside covering the Northeast end of the building and the parking lot. All activities are recorded on a computer so we can check back if we find a problem or law enforcement needs to have information from the system.

Many e-mails are sent with SCAM attachments, so be very careful about opening one from someone you do not know. The message will read, "open attachment to find out...." I know of several people who have bitten on it and opened the attachment. Goodby computer.

We have had a lot of equipment breakdowns at the Post during the last several weeks. The first to breakdown was the dishwasher, then the ice machine and then the large two door commercil refrigerator. I hope that is the end of the breakdowns.

With the weather turning vicious around the world, you may want to consider purchasing a Weather Radio. These radios are tuned to the National Weather Service Radio Network.

If a bad weather pattern is heading our way, you will get instant information on it and instructions on what you should or should not do.
